#### Dean Starck Remembered...



Patricia L. Starck, PhD, RN, FAAN, the longest serving dean in the history of Cizik School of Nursing at UTHealth Houston, passed away Dec. 8, 2024, at the age of 86 "Pat Starck, our 'dean of deans,' was a true legend whose vision transformed Cizik

School of Nursing into a nationally renowned institution," said Giuseppe N. Colasurdo, MD, "Her dedication to nursing education has left an indelible mark on our university and our community. We honor her tremendous impact, celebrate her considerable legacy, and thank her for showing us how to be a servant leader." She led the school from 1984 to 2015, through decades of growth and innovation. In 2023, Dr. Starck was among 13 people honored by <a href="Nurses With Global Impact, Inc">Nurses With Global Impact, Inc</a>. (NWGI) at the United Nations in New York City. Dean Starck joined UTHRO in Dec. 2022.
